## Town Precept information 2025/26

Selby Town Council provides a number of services to the residents of Selby via various statutory powers.

We try to ensure the Town is seen in a positive light and value its history and heritage. These are difficult times for all small market towns, and it is important that we all support the town and its businesses to ensure a local vibrant economy and community.

Included in this information are the events and other activities which we run throughout the year and how we spend the money we get from you (the precept). We are pleased to hear from you on any issue and provide a public participation period at the start of our monthly meetings. These are held on the last Monday of each month (with the exception of August and December). Please contact the office before the meeting and let us know what issue you wish to raise and we will do our best to respond on the night.

Since late 2010 we have been running the regular Monday market and the monthly Farmers Market on the morning of the third Saturday of each month. The Town Council has scheduled a year of events, some you will recognise and some new. We work hard to deliver events to bring more people into town to enjoy our lovely shops, restaurants, and bars. The Town Council employs a Town Clerk, Deputy Town Clerk, Full time Administrative Clerk and 1 Part-time Administrative Clerk, a Facilities Manager, Facilities Supervisor and 3 x Resource Assistants, an Arts Officer, a Part-time Markets/Events Manager, 1 Part-Time Caretaking/cleaner and 1 Part-Time Facilities Assistant.

The Town Council staff manage the Community Centre, run by an independent charitable trust which includes 5 Councillors on its Board of Trustees. The Trust reimburses the Town Council for the cost of these services.

The Town Council owns and runs the Town Hall offices and Arts Centre, the 1811 Building, the Town Cemetery, three allotment sites at Pymbles, Stonebridge and Westbourne Road, three Play Areas, Flaxley Road, Abbots Road and Wistow Road, and a Cemetery Farmhouse which was fully refurbished in 2014. The Cemetery has a lodge and two chapels. The Town Council are planning the refurbishment of the chapels so local schools and groups can use the facilities.

Over the last year we have purchased new picnic tables for Bondgate Community Woodland, replaced the three benches on the Market Place, replaced old play equipment in the play area at the Community Centre and purchased Wildpods, habitats for wildlife, in the Cemetery. There is approx. £90,000 Section 106 Funding available to the Town Council to spend on Recreational Open Space in the Town area. The Town Council will be opening a consultation for the electorate to agree a suitable project. This funding must be spent by 2027.

You will note that the precept has risen in 2025/26. The rise is due to the increase in energy costs and inflation, and also includes estimated repayments for a £700,000 Public Works Loan which the Town Council are considering borrowing to fund the refurbishment of the Cemetery Chapels. This is the maximum amount that the Council have approved to borrow and may be less than this figure.

The precept equates to an increase of £15.98 per year, or 31p per week, for Band D households.
